



### Review of PPSG 2015-2016

*'Through high quality physical education the school aims to enable pupils to become successful learners, confident individuals and responsible citizens who develop as independent enquirers, creative thinkers, reflective learners, team workers, self managers and effective participators.'*

Over the last year, with the support of the PPSG we have:

- Supported access to after school clubs and competitions by funding transport and qualified coaches;
- Ensured that all children have access to local swimming facilities, qualified instructors and ensured that on leaving primary school, all children meet National Curriculum Expectations.
- Developed and implemented a whole school PE long term and medium term plan, clear assessment and monitoring programme and undertaken a whole school questionnaire to collect the views and opinions of our pupils;
- Created an adopted a whole school PE scheme;
- Achieved the Sainsbury's bronze award;
- Promoted physical activity during lunchtimes (Play Leaders) and golden time;
- Invited local businesses to work with KS1 and KS2 children to develop knowledge of health and fitness;
- Invested in playtime and PE lesson equipment;

In support of our Action Plan we will continue to develop:

- Assessment throughout the whole school to ensure good progress is made;
- Monitor deliver PE sessions in connection with Teaching Standards;
- Investigate possible fixed equipment in outside areas (highlighted in questionnaire responses);
- Increase intra – school competitions for all children; working alongside play leaders and house captains;
- Investigate the possibility of increasing the number of swimming sessions available to the children (highlighted in questionnaire responses);
- Work closely with Selby PE cluster to ensure that all children have access to physical activity;
- Develop blogging and children's participation in feedback after sporting events;
- Continue to provide a range of sporting after school clubs that children enjoy;
- Continue to work closely with Play Leaders and House Captains to increase the number of KS2 children who participate in organised games during lunchtimes;
- Continue to invite outside agencies to promote sporting activity above grass root level.



**Key findings – PE Questionnaire**

Based on 202 responses:

23.27% have enjoyed Gymnastics in PE the most this year.

16.83% of respondents have enjoyed Dance and Invasion Games.

Based on 113 responses:

Children have highlighted that they would like a larger range of sports during PE sessions.

For the sports that we do focus on during PE, 68% of those who responded would like to continue to focus on Athletics, Team games, Gymnastics and Dance.

72 Responses stated that they have participated in at least one after school club this year - this would equate to over half of the school population.

Based on 59 responses:

The most enjoyed after school club is Rugby (20.33%)

We have offered 8/ 16 sports mentioned (50%)

We have had many coaches and events at school this year and in particular those who responded enjoyed Sport to the Beat as well as Football skills and Sports for Champions.

We offer physical activity as an option for Golden time each week. Over half of those who responded have chosen to take part in said arranged activities.

75 responses highlighted that they have taken part or will be taking part in a sporting event this year.

Over 33% of those responses highlighted that they took part in Cross Country and this would equate to over 50% of KS2 children.

Results based on KS2 results - question only applicable for KS2

76.47 % of respondents stated that they have taken part in inter school competitions at local schools.

Results based on KS2 results only as only applicable for KS2

62.5% of respondents indicated that they have chosen to participate in organised physical activity at lunchtimes - run by the Play Leaders.

88.52% of those who responded believe that their confidence/self-esteem has grown as a result of sporting activity.

85.96% of those who responded believe that they are motivated to work hard in all lessons because they are keen to do well in all areas of learning.

83.63% of children who have done well in sport believe that they are motivated to achieve success in other subjects.
