

## **PUPIL PREMIUM FUNDING**

At Wistow Parochial Primary School we ensure that teaching and learning opportunities meets the needs of all our pupils and appropriate provision is made for all pupils who belong to vulnerable groups.

We reserve the right to allocate pupil premium funding to support any pupils that we have identified as being vulnerable or socially disadvantaged.

The range of provision that Governors and the Headteacher may consider include reducing the class sizes, providing small group / intervention work and support from Higher Level Trained Teaching Assistants. All this work is aimed to accelerate the progress of these pupils with a specific emphasis on Literacy and Numeracy.

### **PUPIL PREMIUM ALLOCATION FOR 2016/2017 is £5280**

For this year there was 1 pupil in receipt of pupil premium money in Year 6  
There was 1 child in receipt of pupil premium money for part of the year (LAC) in Year R  
There was 1 child in receipt of pupil premium money (LAC) in Year 1.  
There was 1 child in receipt of pupil premium money in Year 5

There are no children in receipt of pupil premium money in Years 2,3,4.

#### **The Headteacher and Governors have targeted PPG to:**

- Providing small group work with experienced teachers and teaching assistants to focus on overcoming gaps in learning and accelerate achievement.
- One to one tuition / support, in class, aimed at ensuring children reach age related expectations in English and Maths in 2016/7there is a particular emphasis on developing progress in Maths.
- Small group work/ 1:1 keep up support daily using RWI to boost phonics.
- Funding our home school link worker for two hours a week to engage with particular families who may be experiencing difficulties and to oversee nurture of particular pupils who may require additional emotional support.
- Funding teaching assistants to support all classes to ensure that all vulnerable groups receive additional support, whether or not they are registered for Free School Meals.
- Funding residential visits (in part) for pupils in receipt of the economic free school meals should they choose to attend.

### **Impact of PPG for 2016/2017**

For this year there was 1 pupil in receipt of pupil premium money in Year 6  
There was 1 child in receipt of pupil premium money for part of the year (LAC) in Year R  
There was 1 child in receipt of pupil premium money (LAC) in Year 1.  
There was 1 child in receipt of pupil premium money in Year 5

There are no children in receipt of pupil premium money in Years 2,3,4

Year 6 – Progress measures were not available for the child. The pupil did not gain the expected level in KS2 Tests – but they made excellent progress from their starting point at Wistow School.

Year R – The progress of the child in Reception was better than expected from their baseline starting point but the child did not reach a GLD across the Early Learning Areas.

Year 3 – The progress of the child in Year 3 was better than expected in R and M but expected at writing. The child is still working below ARE but is receiving regular and focused interventions.

The progress of the child in Year 5 was better than expected in all areas and the child is closer to working at the ARE, Support continues to be given in order to reach at least expected levels at the end of KS1.

### **Impact of PPG for 2014/2015**

There were no disadvantaged children in Years R or 2 for this year.

There were 3 pupils in receipt of funding in Year 6 for this year.

100% of pupils made at least two levels progress in RWM

100% of pupils made three levels progress in Reading and Writing

66% of pupils made three levels progress in GPS

33% of pupils made three levels progress in Maths.

Two pupils received 50% support with the funding for the school residential to Robinwood – enabling them to participate fully in activities.

All other disadvantaged pupils in receipt of FSM or ever 6 across the school made at least expected progress during the year in RWM with some pupils making better than expected progress. The majority of children are working at their age related expectations or above.

Those who are not are receiving regular small group or 1:1 intervention in order to support their development and learning progress both with the class teacher and TA's.

There were no disadvantaged children in Years R 2 or 6 for this year.

All other disadvantaged pupils in receipt of FSM or ever 6 made at least expected progress during the year in RWM with some pupils making better than expected progress. All children are working at their age related expectations or above.

### **PUPIL PREMIUM ALLOCATION FOR 2012/2013 is £3600**

The Headteacher and Governors have targeted PPG to:

- reduce the KS2 size classes to enable us to run smaller classes
- provide teaching assistant support to children who require intervention support in literacy and numeracy.

### **Impact of PPG for 2012/2013**

There were no disadvantaged pupils in receipt of Pupil Premium in Years R 2 and 6 or this year.

All other disadvantaged pupils in receipt of FSM or ever 6 made at least expected progress during the year in all areas of RWM with some children making better than expected progress. All children are working at their age related expectations or above.

### **PUPIL PREMIUM ALLOCATION FOR 2011/2012 was £3600**

The Headteacher and Governors have targeted PPG to:

- boost phonics resources in order to support children in KS1 with their phonics learning.
- providing additional support for emotional aspects through the use of our Home School Link Worker

### **Impact of PPG for 2011/2012**

All children in receipt of FSM in KS1 made better than expected progress from their KS1 starting points in reading, writing and mathematics.

All children in KS2 made better than expected progress from their end of KS1 results.
