These sentences start with a verb, followed by a comma, and then the name of a person along with the rest of the sentence.

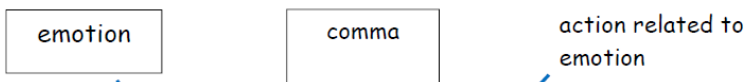

2 pairs sentences begin with 2 pairs of related adjectives:
